## GUIDELINES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

*African Journal of Criminal Law and Jurisprudence (AFJCLJ)* has the objective of publishing peer-reviewed papers dealing strictly with issues on criminal law and criminal jurisprudence which are of relevance to Africa, Africans, and scholars of Africa. AFJCLJ appears once a year in September. It is published online and in print. The Journal is abstracted and indexed with Google scholar and other major indexing outfits. It provides a forum for legal scholars and jurists to report research findings for policy making through innovative and advanced methodologies. Well researched and original papers on topical subject matters, and which extend the frontiers of knowledge with a view to solving developmental problems are hereby welcome.

### Guidelines to Authors

#### 1. Language

The language of the manuscript must be English (either American or British standards, but not the mixture of both).

#### 2. Length of paper

The length of the paper should not exceed 7000 words excluding tables, figures, references and appendices (if any). Articles should be typed in 1.5 line spacing (footnotes and references should appear in single line spacing) on one side of A4 paper only with wide margins. Authors are urged to write as concisely as possible, but not at the expense of clarity.

#### 3. Title Page

The title page should include: (i) The name(s) of the author(s), (ii) A concise and informative title, (iii) The affiliation(s) and address (es) of the author(s), (iv) The e-mail address, and telephone numbers of the corresponding author.

#### 4. Abstract

Please provide an abstract of 150 to 200 words which must include the objectives of the study, methodology, findings/results, method of data collection and summary of recommendations. The abstract should not contain any undefined abbreviations or unspecified references.

#### 5. Keywords

Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.

#### 6. Subdivision of the article

Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections. Subsections should be numbered 1, 2, (then 1.1, 1.1.1, 1.1.2), 1.2, etc). The abstract is not included in section numbering.

#### 7. References

Author(s) should adhere strictly to the following referencing and documentation style:
