- Manuscript must be word processed in Microsoft word, Times New Roman font style, 12-point font size, 1.5 line spacing, typed in A4 paper and not exceeding 15 pages length including references.
- Cover page of completed papers bearing author(s) name, surname, and middle name including institutional affiliation should be on a separate file with title of paper as file name (so as to facilitate blind review of articles).
- Manuscript for publication in the journal must make an original contribution to knowledge in International Relations, and must not have been submitted or published elsewhere.
