He was ordained on 20th December, 1953 at St Peter's Basilica, Rome by Cardinal Perfect of Propaganda Fidei: Pietro Fummasoni Bondi. He has Master's degree in Canon Law (J.C.L) from Pontifical Urbaniana Uinversitas. Nnadiebube is a Sage and a protagonist of Inculturation (Theology of Incarnation) as the Christian's contextualization of Faith (Gospel) and Culture (Tradition). He is a great ancestor on how to be Igbo and a true Christian via his *peculiar characteristic* Christianization of African-Igbo Cultures, that is, an *Africanization* of Christianity, decades before Inculturation became the evangelical refrain of Vatican 11 Council (1962-65).
