NOTE ON SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS

The Nigeria Police Academy Journal of Humanities (POLACJOH) is a university-based peer reviewed journal, published by the Faculty of Humanities, Nigeria Police Academy Wudil, Kano state. The journal is published in both print and online versions.

POLACJOH accepts manuscripts that contribute to knowledge in the following fields: Linguistics, Nigerian Languages, French, Literature, English Language, History and International Studies, as well as Security Studies. These are dominant core areas in the Arts and Humanities. However, the journal is not only limited to contributions from these alone. Thus, in line with the goal of advancement of knowledge in different fields of research, the journal incorporates interdisciplinary approaches and accepts contributions from other disciplines, particularly in the Social Sciences, and Law.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

1. Only manuscripts that are original products of individual research efforts, which have not been published before or submitted for consideration in other journals should be submitted. All sources should be duly identified and acknowledged, as the journal would not be held liable for works that are plagiarised.
2. Submitted manuscripts should contain the Name(s) of the author(s), with the surname CAPITALISED; institutional affiliation, email and the phone number of ONLY the contact person in case of multiple authors.
3. The main outline should include an Abstract of not more than 250 words, including five key words. The contents should be written in Times New Roman; 12 pts. and 1.5 line spacing. The entire contents of the manuscript including abstracts and references should not exceed 6,000 words.
4. Articles are to be written in British style English and NOT American style English.
5. All submitted articles will be subjected to blind peer review by our external assessors who are professionals in the topics of interest. Note also that, all manuscript would be subjected to an online plagiarism test.
6. The approved citation style for the journal is the in-text (author, date: page) citation, based on the American Psychological Association (APA) Style 7th Edition.
